

Chattanooga Fire and Police Pension Fund

Guidelines for Public Comment at Board Meetings

The Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Chattanooga Fire and Police Pension Fund (the "Fund") hereby establishes guidelines for public comments at Board meetings.

The Board will allow a public comment period at the end of each scheduled Board meeting. The total public comment period for the entire Board meeting will not exceed 30 minutes unless the Board President or authorized representative (the "President") determines, at the President's discretion, that additional time is necessary to address comments or concerns. Each speaker will be limited to a maximum of three minutes per speaker.

The following rules will apply to speakers at Board meetings:


1. The Board President will recognize the speaker.
2. Each speaker addressing the Board will be limited to a maximum of three minutes. A speaker may not give his or her time to another speaker.
3. Each speaker must conduct himself or herself in a respectful manner and, at the discretion of the Board President, may be restricted from speaking if the speaker engages in threatening, obscene, or disruptive behavior.
4. The Board, in its discretion, may ask questions of any speaker providing public comment. If the Board asks questions, it will not count against the maximum of three minutes.

These guidelines have been established effective May 07, 2026, by the Board, whose signatures appear below.


